

SPECIAL NEEDS FOR CHILDREN & FAMILIES



- 17 Orphans & vulnerable children
- 10 Elders with leprosy

IMPACT: Our most vulnerable beneficiaries had all their needs met and were able to live with dignity, in community, without the fear of social stigma, being abandoned or being separated from loved ones due to poverty.

IMPACT: As a result of educational supports during the pandemic, young people maintained their studies during school closures and the Gr. 8 & 12 students were equipped to take National Exams. Davcare children continued to learn through weekly packets sent home. Children continued to learn and grow, becoming equipped and empowered, which increased their potential to help themselves and their families break out of poverty.

YOUTH ACTIVITIES



frequenting the trash dump or dropping out of school. Children were motivated and inspired to build healthy relationships with themselves, God and others.

IMPACT: Families & youth recognized their own value and the value of others, they became better prepared to face



the challenges and roadblocks poverty presents, and they were empowered to break the poverty mindset so prevalent in Korah.

ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

IMPACT: Economic trainings & measures led to 13 women forming an artisan cooperative; 23 women were empowered to find work or start planning their businesses, and took necessary steps towards self-sufficiency beyond HFK programs.

- 35 Chronic or acutely ill, immunity-compromised and/or undernourished individuals - ongoing monthly
- 10 Prenatal/Lactating mothers

- *16 Preschool children 2 daily meals/snacks at daycare.**

IMPACT: Through added nutrition & micronutrient support vulnerable children & pregnant/breastfeeding women, maintained health; there was no need for acute malnutrition support amongst beneficiaries; families experienced no



desperation related to food scarcity associated with COVID-19. Those who were chronically ill, immune compromised (HIV+) or needed nutrition for acute illness/medication; maintained or improved their health.



- 49 Adults received coping skills/ stress management training
- 61 Adults received parenting skills training

17 Adults received ongoing professional counselling

- 21 Adults attended group counselling sessions 150 Children & youth participated Young Life Spiritual activities
- Adults & Youth received one-to-one counselling from social workers

IMPACT: Families were equipped to cope with stress, applied healthier communication and parenting techniques, began healing and working through past traumas, increased their sense of self-worth and value before God. This significantly impacted their personal life, family and ability to begin working on their future.
