Bosana used to beg on the streets to provide for her family and blind husband with leprosy. Today she has her own marketplace selling coffee related items. Her girls attend college, one has graduated and works in accounting to help support the family. Bosana is thankful and greatly values the hand-up and support she has received.



Our daycare began with a simple table and bench. Today we are thankful that many can be blessed by our much expanded daycare center.



In May 2011 the Berta Breakfast Program served its first bowl of porridge to 50 children. We quickly discovered Ethiopian children much preferred eating with their hands and so Berta pancakes were created. Fast forward 10 years... Two months ago HFK launched a new program at a local school, targeting 120 undernourished kindergarten and special needs children. Being concerned for their development, the school asked HFK to partner with them and we now provide a highly nutritious breakfast consisting of fortified pancakes, a protein, fresh vegetables or fruit (above right). Add to this, the 225 kids already being served at our HFK compound six days per week... and that is a lot of pancakes!!

# TEN YEARS IN KORAH

Looking back at some of our first sponsored families and programs and where they are today.

Ten Years of Working Together for Hope!

Meeting Beylanesh and her children was the catalyst that led to the founding of HFK (photo on right). At that time they were living in a dark hovel with nothing, not even a blanket or food. Beylanesh is disabled and has only one partial foot. She scavenged at the dump and begged to survive. Her 14 year old with special needs had never been to school, her baby was very sick. She felt hopeless.

Today their lives have changed - all three kids are in school and Beylanesh is a role model to many of our women. She is motivated to change, and is the president of the Basket Weavers' Association providing income through making baskets and spinning cotton for a local store. Soon she plans to start a business selling charcoal. She has much hope for the future!
